

THE BUILDERS' ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION

The Builders' Association Scholarship Foundation is a nonprofit endowment fund whose mission is to support scholarships, high-impact research, and educational programs in the commercial construction industry.

Each year, scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$3,000 per student. Criteria for scholarship eligibility will be based on need, motivation, scholarship, attitude, and interest in a construction industry career within the area served by The Builders' Association.¹

Scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis. Applicants will be eligible to apply for up to four years of undergraduate study in construction or engineering, or a dual degree to include either construction or engineering or both.

Application Requirements

Submit your application using the forms provided. To be considered, all application materials, including rating sheets, **must be submitted in one packet by December 15** to: The Builders' Association Scholarship Foundation, ATTN: Dr. Joseph E. Pink, 105 West 12th Avenue, North Kansas City, Missouri 64116. Academic transcripts must be received by December 15 directly from the school.

1. Order **official transcripts of your academic records**, high school and college if applicable, and have them sent **directly** to The Builders' Association Scholarship Foundation.
2. Provide **one rating sheet** to your high school guidance counselor or college faculty advisor, whichever is applicable at the time of application.
3. Provide **one rating sheet** to one adult nonfamily member who is familiar with your academic or professionally-related experience.
4. Complete the **application form** provided.
5. All finalists will be interviewed by The Builders' Association Scholarship Committee. Applications will be reviewed and winners selected by the Board of Directors of The Builders' Association Scholarship Foundation which will consider the applicant's financial need, interest in construction, grades, extracurricular activities, adult evaluations, and interviews.
6. Scholarships are distributed based on standards which do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, age, gender, and national or ethnic origin.
