A 2016 Centers for Disease Control (CDC) study ranked the construction industry first in total suicides and second in suicide rate compared to all other industries in the United States. According to the CDC, there is one death by suicide every 12 minutes in the United States. Although, these are national statistics, here in the Midwest we have not been immune by the tragic impact of the growing number of suicides in our industry. The number of association member companies who have been effected by a suicide of an associate, trade partner associate, friend or family member has grown sustainably over the last few years.
